

- 4. Today is the is the magnificent Feast of Christ the King, the Patronal Feast of Christ the King Abbey.
- 5. We will have Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament immediately following the 10:00 AM Mass in the Abbey Church this morning.
- 6. Monday, October 29, 2007, is the transferred Feast of Saints Simon and Jude, Apostles.

 November is the Month of the Poor Souls in Purgatory. Do not forget the Toties Quoties indulgence for the Poor Souls. "If a man devotes his life to working either directly or indirectly for the salvation of souls, and reaches such a degree of detachment from self that without neglecting his own perfection he leaves to others the merit of his actions, prayers, and suffering ... that man draws down abundant graces on the world ... he himself reaches a high degree of sanctity, far higher than he would have attained had he sought only his own advancement." (Words of Our Lord Himself to Sister Josefa Menéndez, in *The Way of Divine Love*)

DEATH IS OUR PROFESSOR THE GRAVE IS OUR CLASS ROOM

It is quite unfortunate and to our definite disadvantage that we shy away from all conversation about death and the final judgment that follows death. Our understanding of death and judgment is critically important and we should come to ask ourselves why the thought of death and the horrifying judgment picture should be such a cause of fear. To begin with let us know that the fear of the Lord is the beginning if the beginning of wisdom. Many of us go through life claiming that we love God, but in a manner of speaking do we actually love God? What exactly is the quality of the love we speak of? If we love Him as we say we do, then how do we account for our forgetfulness of Him in almost all of our daily activities and affairs? How do we account for our innumerable follies and pleasure seeking and all of the improper fun and frolic that surround us from all sides? How do we explain our littleness and our love and attachments that we waste on the small and mean things of life - all the small and useless objects we seek day after day? How do we explain the books we read, or the movies we view, or the internet findings we carefully and painstakingly seek out? How do we explain our casual attitude toward our religious duties and obligations, especially attendance at Holy Mass? If there is anything distressing in a Christian's life, one who professes to be a Christian – a Catholic Christian – it is meanness. Like it or not, a Christian - a Catholic Christian - stands on a rather elevated platform. When a Christian habitually demeans himself by constant self-seeking, by self-love, by self-convenience, by self-indulgence, by frequent attention getting fits of temper, and all the rest, the Christian shirks everything noble and healthy for one of such a high calling. A Christian, by his very name, professes to reflect Christ, but how often it is that he does not, and when he looks in the mirror, who, actually, does he see? It is a shame and a very disappointing sight, really a very loathing sight, to see such conduct in anyone who claims that he loves God! Is this not a mockery, a mockery that cries out to heaven for vengeance? Is this not a mockery that will, eventually, receive vengeance? To be sure! Lest we forget, let everyone subject to moral deterioration be concerned as to how such a life of deceitful "goodness" measure up at the judgment seat of God, where all things and all moods and all falsehood and all cunning and all seduction will suddenly become most important and serious!

Who, do we think, will be present at the moment of judgment besides our Supreme Judge, God Almighty, Himself? Angels? Demons? Friends? Parents? Family? Business associates? Anyone at all – either pleading for us or accusing us? NOBODY? NOBODY AT ALL! Even though the Blood of Life will be open before us, with the Judgment be in the form of an earthly court trial – with witnesses? Not at all likely! We mistakenly fancy such a scene, a scene where we present a defense, but this is idle imagination. Even if angels or devils were present at our judgment it would make no difference. Their presence would not matter at all. Neither angel nor devil nor friend nor family nor anyone at all can at that moment anymore be either of help or of hurt to us. It will all be only a matter of record. Nothing more. My soul – I – ME – will be all alone with God. We ask, how, then, will the judgment take place? How, then, will the judgment take place? We can only guess.

For a moment let us contemplate. Let us to up a high hill and stand there just before a thunder storm. The atmosphere is oppressive and gloomy. The valley below is all black and foggy. The entire landscape completely shrouded in darkness. Suddenly, from out of the darkness there leaps a single flash, it lights up in an instant the hill and valley, and all things there about. It was all gone just as soon as it came. In one electrical stroke everything came into mysterious view. Maybe our judgment will be something like that. In the flash of an instant we will see all the ups and downs of our entire lives. Everything will come into view!

Our time of power over our actions comes to an end at the instant of death. At such times when we think of death and judgment we panic, and turn quickly to whatever may be of help. Some of us turn, even, to the thoughts of the long gone practice of sackcloth and ashes, a practice of earlier times no longer observed or understood generally. However a serious penitent, filled with the enormity of his sin and with the fear of God will seek out the next best remedy and work to apply it with committed determination. This determination cannot be fleeting or it means nothing. Repentance means a complete change in attitude. Repentance means the full force of the CONVERSIO. Some scoff at the thought of sackcloth, even in the abstract. It if takes contemplation of a life of sackcloth and ashes to keep a soul out of hell, then such a soul would be a perfect fool to consider such a practice a silly medieval fanaticism!

Let us keep this thought in mind. If one goes to hell it is because he has put himself in hell. If one does not go to hell it is because he did not put himself in hell, but in heaven! If we live out our lives according to the holy expectations of God, we have no reason to fear either death or judgment. A good man who lives with the love of God in his heart has a right to a holy and happy death and a pleasing and delightful judgment. Fear not, go forth, and sin no more. Thy faith has saved thee!
