- SEPTUAGESIMA SEASON -

Septuagesima is the name of that period of time prior to the actual beginning of the holy Season of Lent. It is Lenten in character and appearance, but it is not itself Lent, and the Lenten fasts have not yet begun. Lent actually begins with Ash Wednesday. As Lent prepares us for the Easter glory of the Resurrection, so does the Septuagesima Season prepare us for Lent. The Traditional Roman Catholic Church, by it liturgy, suggests to both priest and people the beginnings of a penitential observance. Thus, the joyful exclamation of Alleluia is omitted from both the Mass and the Divine Office, and will in no case be herd again until the time of the glorious Resurrection of Our Lord. All flowers are

removed from the altars and from before all the statues of the saints. The high altar coverings are all purple, and the

priest wears purple vestments. When the Mass is of the Season of Septuagesima or of Lent, the Gloria in Excelsis Deo is not said. Septuagesima is the Latin word which means "seventy." The name is applied to this Sunday specifically and is presumed to be the seventieth day before Easter. Sexagesima means "sixty," and Quinquagesima means "fifty." However, the names and the actual number of the counted days do not correspond and the names are not accurate descriptions of the time involved. Whatever their origin, they are now regarded simply as convenient titles.
