"Actually, we know little of the pains of Purgatory. The Church is content to tell us that the sinner must undergo expiatory suffering here or in the next world, before being admitted into the kingdom of heaven. If we question the theologians, they reply that the souls in Purgatory suffer especially from not being able to see God; it is this postponement that is by far their greatest agony. Here on earth we have an obscure and very imperfect knowledge of God; His ineffable sweetness escapes our understanding. Thence arise the efforts we must make to think of Him and not to be absorbed by all that surrounds us. With the coming of death, however, all is changed; joys, pleasures, honors, riches all these are as nothing to the separated soul. God alone is everything, God alone is left for the soul to have; and this God is so beautiful and so great, and He contains all good things as He is the supreme and absolute Good. The soul longs to go to Him and to possess Him forever. It is vain, however, for it merely to sigh for Him with all the ardor and all the strength of which it is capable; it must first
