

These embrace the very foundation of the true Catholic-Christian life. Today this fundamental structure is neglected in extensive areas of present-day so-called Catholic teaching. The result has been a disintegration of the <u>Sense</u> of Faith (*the sensus Catholicus*) in the new generations, who are almost fully incapable of comprehending their religion. Even the older generation has, to a great degree, lost sight of the fundamental structure of Catholicism, and has therefore become a product of a secular humanist infiltrated educational and social system. As a consequence most Catholic people no longer recognize an <u>UNBIBLICAL WAY OF LIFE</u> when they see it in operation. <u>Worse yet</u>, they do not know that they don't know!!!



WHAT IS BAPTISM?

Baptism is the Sacrament which cleanses us from original sin, makes us Christians, children of God, and heirs of Heaven.

WHAT IS PENANCE?

Penance is the Sacrament by which sins committed after Baptism are forgiven.

WHAT IS THE HOLY EUCHARIST?

Holy Eucharist is the Sacrament which contains the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Our Lord Jesus Christ, under the appearances of bread and wine.

WHAT IS CONFIRMATION?

Confirmation is the Sacrament through which the Holy Ghost comes to us in a special way and enables us to profess our Faith as strong and perfect Christians and Soldiers of Jesus Christ.

WHAT IS EXTREME UNCTION?

Extreme Unction is a Sacrament, which, through the anointing and prayer of the priest, gives health and strength to the soul, and sometimes to the body, when we are in danger of death.

WHAT IS HOLY ORDERS?

Holy Orders is a Sacrament by which bishops, priests and other ministers of the church are ordained and receive the power and grace to perform their sacred duties.

WHAT IS MATRIMONY?

Matrimony is a Sacrament which unites a Christian man and woman in lawful marriage.
