One who thinks that were he living in Nazareth during the time of Our Blessed Lord, he would desire to go very often to see Our Lord, and who does not now desire to go often to the church where the same Lord dwells, is labouring under a falsehood. Such a one is wanting in a quality faith. It is the same loving Saviour, with the same kind heart, the same benignity, the same majesty, the same holiness and the same zeal for our good, who once abode in Nazareth and now abides in our Tabernacle. He will receive us now as He would then. He would not have shown Himself cold to us simply because we had proved ourselves weak, imperfect, wayward or even forgetful. All He looks for is that we should desire to approach Him and turn away from what displeases Him. He is of unwearied kindness, and His great desire is to do us good and make us supernatural. That is the sole reason of His Presence in our Tabernacles. But we must never forget that He is Divine as well as human. We must always approach with a profound sense of reverence as well as with an unbounded confidence. If this be our ordinary attitude, we can, with joyous expectation, look forward, when our life draws to its close, to meet as our Judge Him with Whom we have dealt during our life as with a friend..

It simply cannot be said that one is abstaining when one continues to enjoy the taste of meat or whatever; one cannot fast without feeling hunger; one is not being obedient if, at the same time, he insists on his own way; one is not considered patient while such a one storms in and out of ordinary family happenings; one is not prayerful if such a one does not pray.
3. Do not forget that this is EASTER DUTY TIME, which means that each one must receive the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist.
