The future of the world is, indeed, a most difficult one, and one filled with problems never before heard of or thought of. The future of the Church of God is much more difficult, and the problems found therein are so bad that one finds himself unable to describe them. The causes of the disaster in the Church are: the desertion of God, the desertion of the Commandments of God, and the desertion of the discipline given to man by God. A world without God, without belief in God, a world disregarding God's unalterable Commandments, and prohibitions, a world abandoning and demolishing the order that God, the Father of creation, has put into nature and man; such a world is moving incessantly towards chaos and the abyss. The desertion of God is the work of a knowledge full of pride and of disloyal servants of the House of God. Great is the number of priests who never mention God, and who do not teach God to the little children, and who have abandoned and have interiorly lost God. The desertion of God is followed by the desertion of God's Commandments. The desertion of God leads to an unholy work and opens the door of indifference and points out the road to sin and crime. Some of the shepherds of the people who have been anointed, are no longer what they are supposed to be: they permit and they actually teach man that man should pay his respects and homage to man, rather than that man should pay homage ONLY AND DIRECTLY to God, Himself!
