- 1 There will be Catechism classes after 10:00 AM Mass this morning.
 - Confessions are ordinarily heard before Masses on Sunday at all Traditional Roman Catholic Chapels. It seems that there are those wherever who take the matter of the Sacrament of Penance lightly or are of the wrong opinion that the Sacrament of Penance is really not seriously necessary and not important if one is not in the state of mortal sin. Such ones, rarely, if ever, go to confession. Then claim that they have "nothing worthwhile" to confess. They are of the opinion that they can go directly to God to attend to their daily problems and usual habits of "small sins." So, why bother with confession? They argue that regular confession promotes the bane of scrupulosity. They give no thought to the fact that those who avoid the Sacrament of Penance continuously are guilty of a basic modernist novus-ordo catholic mind set, which is a serious case of presumption and which is in itself a serious sin, to be sure! If proper forgiveness of sin told to a validly ordained priest in confession is unnecessary, then everything else Catholic that we normally do as bona fide and honest Catholics is equally unnecessary. Confession of sins to a priest is a Sacrament which gives grace and strength to the soul.
 - In our terrible, troubled days, all filled with situations both fair and foul, let us do everything we can to protect ourselves and our loved ones as best we can. Just as all around us people store important items of food and clothing for reasons of safety and survival, so must we also store items of greater importance items, we must store items of a religious nature in our houses. Let us not be wanting in such matters. Such items are of supreme importance. Therefore, keep plenty of holy water in your homes at all times. We have plenty of holy water in the Abbey Church. We give it just for the asking. Soon you will receive blest ashes on Ash Wednesday and then later you will receive blest palm on Palm Sunday. Be certain that you have these items stored away in your homes and keep them in the vicinity of your home chapels. Also, it is very important to have Benedictine Medals in your homes. Work to obtain one or more! We have a limited supply of them. May God Bless you and protect you in every way. Allow your homes to be places of prayer and holiness: and serenity and peace.
