

One cannot fast without feeling hunger; one is not being obedient if, at the same time he continues to insist on his own way; one is not considered patient if such a one's continuous temper tantrums stomp in and out of ordinary family and daily happenings and family discussions; one is not prayerful if such a one does not pray.

During Lent we should make the effort - REAL <u>EFFORT</u> - to come to a better understanding of just what the SPIRITUAL-INTERIOR LIFE <u>REALLY</u> MEANS. It must remain the responsibility of all Latin Rite Catholic Pulpits to teach the people the basic elements of INTERIOR SPIRITUALITY==NOT TECHNICAL, CATECHICAL, POLEMICAL INFORMATION which seem to be the normal pulpit menu in many places.
