The mysteries of Christ's life are something more than mere historical events. If we consider these mysteries exclusively in their historical aspect, the life of Our Lord, as related to us by the Evangelists, will be to us much the same as would be the meagre record of the acts and words of any great and good man, whose fate excites our pity and whose heroism stirs our admiration. It would be that and nothing more. But the incidents narrated by the Evangelists are something more than the lifeless facts of history. They have a life-giving potency that does not and cannot belong to the ordinary living incidents committed to the pages of human records. Far from being "dead" fact they are a perpetually energising force in the world. They are, as it were, a typical and dramatic representation of the experiences that the christian soul must go through in the process of becoming saintly. THE LIFE OF CHRIST MUST NOT BE SOLELY AN EXTERNAL OBJECTIVE EVENT WHICH WE CONTEMPLATE BECAUSE WE ENJOY THE THOUGHTS, BUT AN INTERNAL EXPERIENCE WHICH WE UNDERGO. The phases of that life are to be reproduced in our personal experiences if we are to be faithful to our christian vocation - that is, if we are to correspond to God's designs in our regard and follow the spiritual path that He has traced out for us.
