Strictly speaking, there is no such thing as a TRIDENTINE LATIN MASS of St. Pius V. Neither the Council of Trent nor St. Pius V wrote this Mass. The Mass as we still see it (now in only too few places) has been celebrated without essential change since the earliest days of the Church. All that Pope Pius V did was to have it PRINTED in Missal form and then issue his QUO PRIMUM DECREE warning that these prayers must never be changed or altered under penalty of excommunication. This is answer to those bishops and priests who try to explain that, if Pope Pius V could write a Mass, then Pope Paul VI could also write a Mass. Pope St. Pius V did not presume to write his own Mass. He had the scholars and theologians of his day search back into all the written records of the Mass from the earliest days and put them together in the form of the Roman Missal which has been used by every priest during every Mass since the Missal was published. (The composers of the New Order Mass indicate that they have also gone to original sources for the composition of their Mass - STRANGE that their composition is so nearly identical to the composition of the Anglican worship service??) Until the last few years, the Church has always carefully guarded the wording and ritual of the Holy Sacrifice. The form of Consecration was expressly determined by the Council of Florence in 1442.
