The death of Christ on the cross was a true sacrifice. Christ offered Himself to His heavenly Father to expiate the sins of the world. As a Victim, He suffered first. Then He died, crying: "It is consummated!" thus completing the sacrifice. On Calvary, Christ Himself was the Highpriest, and at the same time the Victim. This sacrifice reconciled God with man. Since the Jewish sacrifices were only a foreshadowing of Our Lord's sacrifice, they ceased when His was offered, as foretold by the prophets. THE MASS is the sacrifice of the New Law in which Christ, through the ministry of the priest, offers Himself to God in an unbloody manner under the appearances of bread and wine. As soon as the priest mentions the words of consecration - the entire substance of the bread and the entire substance of the wine are TRANSUBSTANTIATED into the entire substance of the FLESH and the entire substance of the BLOOD. Only the QUALITIES of bread and the QUALITIES of wine remain - we call these qualities the ACCIDENTS. ALL of the substances are completely and absolutely changed, not SYMBOLICALLY (as is now being taught) but ACTUALLY. No longer is there bread to eat, but actual FLESH. No longer is there wine to drink, but actual BLOOD. THIS IS THE UNCHANGEABLE TEACHING OF THE CHURCH. To preach, teach or think that the Eucharist is nothing more than a symbol is heretical and simply NOT CATHOLIC - - NO MATTER WHO PREACHES OR TEACHES THIS UNFORTUNATE PROPOSITION.
