Christ's poverty was a condemnation of the world's theory of worth. For the world, man's wealth lies in the possession of a large quantity of material goods: property, money, and a great deal of credit. It believes that these material possessions add to a man's dignity and add to his worth. The soul of truth that is in Christ revolted against this utterly false persuasion. Man is rich, not by what he has, but BY WHAT HE IS. One day it will be said to such a one of the world: "Thou fool, this night do I require thy soul of thee" and such a one must enter into an existence where this world's goods CANNOT follow him. In that existence, man is what he is; there the false distinction he drew from wealth is TORN from him. Nothing outside a man can add to man! Riches cannot add a cubit to a man's human stature, that is, to his value as measured by the scale of manhood. Christ was poor in worldly wealth. It was not through powerlessness, through lack of ability to acquire it. His poverty was not an enforced poverty. He was poor, not by necessity, but by deliberate choice. Although the earth and all it had was His by right, He allowed Himself to be in want of all things. He had not even where to lay His head. But the poverty of Christ was simply a magnificent independence of all created things. Christ despised the silly distinction that worldly things give to worldly men. He set His Heart on that distinction that came to Him from God!
