It is true that if the Fall had not taken place, there would be no such thing as pain, and all the creatures would minister pleasure to men. But now things are otherwise. It often happens that pleasant things, far from being a necessary element of man's happiness, bring about his ruin. On the other, hand, the things that prove painful to his sensitive nature, instead of being the cause of unhappiness, can become, in the hands of Divine Providence, the instrument of our highest good. Our selection of things must not be determined by their pleasure-giving capacity, but by their aptitude to promote the salvation of our souls. All softness, ease, luxury - - all that administers sensual gratification - - was rigidly excluded from Christ's life. At the outset of His life on earth, monotonous toil was his lot; afterwards, intense apostolic labour, much journeying on foot, daily contraditons, and homelessness Suffering was His portion.
