The DOGMA OF HELL is the most terrible truth of our faith. THERE IS A HELL!! We are as sure of it as of the existence of God, the existence of the sun. Nothing is more clearly revealed than the dogma of hell, and our Blessed Lord speaks of it many times in Sacred Scripture. The dreadful truth of hell was revealed to men from the beginning of time, and it is conformable to natural reason. All peoples, in one way or another, have acknowledged hell. Pagans, too, have acknowledged hell and spoke of it as the Under-World - a very dreadful place where the light of day never came upon it. - - always winter - never Spring or fruitful Summer. It has been reserved for modern men, filled with the atheism of the NEW AGE, to outdo the impiety of all ages by denying the existence of hell. They laugh at hell. Is a matter which affects the everlasting destiny of man laughable? Is the question which deals with an ETERNITY of punishment by fire a question to be laughed at? But their very laughter shores up the dogma of hell all the more - - one does not laugh at something that does not exist. Unhappy men who wish that there might not be one, and in their laughter they try to persuade themselves that there is none.
