A year before His death, Christ spoke to the Jews in the Capharnaum synagogue a discourse in which He manifested His intention of instituting the Holy Eucharist. "The Bread that I will give is MY FLESH, for the life of the world." The Jews took scandal at these words, and asked: "How can this man give us His flesh to eat?" But Jesus said to them: "Except you eat the Flesh of the Son of Man, and drink His Blood, you shall not have life in you." These words must be taken literally for the Jews understood them literally, AS THEIR CONDUCT PROVES. The disciples also understood them literally. Jesus wished them to be understood literally. Even though the Jews took offense at His words, he DID NOT EXPLAIN THEM AWAY, but solemnly declared: "My Flesh is meat indeed, and My Blood is drink indeed." Those who refused to believe were told that they would be excluded from eternal life. If Christ had not intended His words to be understood literally, He would have used different words or He would have EXPLAINED His words as a FUGURE OF SPEECH - - AS HE ALWAYS DID OF ALL OTHER SUCH OCCASIONS. It is interesting to nate the conduct of many in the church today - - both priests and people. Does not their conduct clearly indicate that they DO NOT accept these words. They DO NOT SEE FLESH - they see ONLY BREAD! Therefore they eat what they see - they eat only bread - - NOTHING MORE!!!! And their priests give them only bread - - - NOTHING MORE!!!!
