It is false to suppose that man - any man - modern man - does not want, or feels that he does not need, some form of authority over him to guide him in life. In all the ages of man, and on all the pages of history, man has shown a desire for authority over him. Man has always been under some form of authority BUT, man wants authority that HE CAN TRUST. He wants strong and capable authority. When man - any man - sees that christians (Catholics especially) follow the authority of their churches trustingly and lovingly, he is impressed, and he is drawn to wonder if the apparently difficult ways of christians (Catholics especially) may not indeed be the Good News of Holy Scripture. This does not mean that man does not understand that authority, even in such places as churches does not need to be reshaped from time to time. Man understands that when there are problems, that corrections have to be made, even changes. Man understands that when there has been any hint of dominance or exploitation or irresponsibility of LACK OF LOYALTY AND FAITH in the Word of the Gospel on the part of church officials - FROM THE BOTTOM TO THE VERY TOP - action must be instituted to make proper corrections. There are times when authority must be corrected. Authority is a service, and this is the image that must be presented and a reality that must be lived. BUT AUTHORITY ITSELF MUST REMAIN, AND MUST REMAIN PLAINLY EVIDENT. In other words, authority must remain AUTHORITATIVE at all times. Only then does it project the image which is demonstrated in The Good News., and then man follows that AUTHORITY IN ALL CERTAINTY.

5. Pray for the Sick and Shut-Ins of our Chapels.
6. Pray for GOOD VOCATIONS to our Monastery-for Priests and Brothers.
