But when we approach the Sacrament we should remember that the FRIENDSHIP we have injured by our sins is the GREATEST of all friend ships. More than that, we should remember that it is against our GREATEST FRIEND and LOVER that we have sinned. More than that still, we should try to see that, even apart from His Friendship towards ourselves, we have treate Him in His OWN Self badly and shamefully by our sin, for He is so deserving o ALL OUR LOVE. In other words, it is well to try to be sorry for our sins because that have offended HIM, even if we start by being sorry because they have injured ourselves. Even though our sorrow may not reach the height of perfect contrition, we must not fail to have complete confidence in the generosity of God's pardon. Provided that we have the minimum sorrow for the validity of the Sacrament, the ab solution has its due effect upon our souls; the the Grace of God, with the infused virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity especially that of Charity which has been lost by mortal sin - are poured into our souls. This restored Virtue of Charity gives us the power of loving God again with a SUPERNATURAL love, and we should strive to awaken the love after confession if we have not been able to do so before it.

The danger among religious people who are not religious enough is to fasten on a doctrine - - (something they have read - or - something that somesaid) then they wrench it from its context, and apply it as if it were a poultice. Such - priests and people alike - very often look at the EXTERNALS of our religion to the detriment of deep sincere SPIRITUALITY. Errors of this kind can be caused by a wrong understanding of the function of symbolism: the emblem can come to mean more than the truth which it represents. In truth, symbolism is very important, but it is not meant to take the place of the

mystery it represents. Is it any wonder that one can fail to grow spiritually while employing all of the good and proper representations of that spirituality.

And so it can be with the Sacred PASSION of our Lord. If the Passion fails to produce among Christians the sanctity which might be expected, it it not the Passion's fault. It is the fault of the Christian who gets NO FURTHER THAN THE INSTRUMENTS OF THE PASSION, who sees only the SCENES of the Passion, who gives NOTHING in return to the Passion but a superficial devotion to its SYMBOLS. The Passion is a grace to the soul, and if the soul is to benefit there MUST BE A RESPONSE AT THE SAME LEVEL: IT MEANS GIVING. CHRIST is the central figure, giving out and drawing in. The Passion is not Christ's sacrifice only;

it is ours as well. THERE CAN BE NO CRICIFIXION WITHOUT BLOOD !!!!
