In the confessing of one's sins to the priest, it should be clearly noted that SINCERE SORROW is quite necessary, but nevertheless quite compatible with a well-founded fear of falling again (and again). When a bad habit has been formed, such a fear can easily arise. All that is necessary for absolution is that one DECIDE HERE AND NOW not to repeat the sin and to avoid the danger of falling into it again. The fact that weakness afterwards overcomes us, does not change the value of the confession. Some people have a VERY OBSTINATE sort of PRIDE which makes them very UNWILLING to ADMIT the guilt of their actions. They feel that they would be lowering themselves in the admission of their guilt. Some go so far as to say that GUILT MUST NEVER BE ADMITTED TO ANYONE (NOT EVEN TO GOD HIMSELF!!!). But the necessary truth is quite the opposite. When a one insists on the RIGHTNESS of his action, which in truth it was really a wrong action, he is merely showing his own LACK of ideals and the lowness of his moral standards. When, on the contrary, he admits that HE HAS BEEN WRONG AND THAT HIS ACTIONS HAVE BEEN WRONG, and that HE IS SORRY FOR THEM, he shows that he has RAISED himself to a new level of ideals and to a higher moral standard. Even in the natural order, such a man immediately raises himself to a higher standard of morals and respectability by admitting (in truth and real and genuine statement) his error.
