NEXT SUNDAY is the LAST Sunday after Pentecost, and thus we are once again reminded of the situation which WILL prevail at the end time. Personal holiness of life should be each one's main concern. If there be holiness in us, we need not dread the end time. Only those WITHOUT HOLINESS fear those days. For one to be of proper preparation and disposition, one must have clearly in mind that God WANTS him to be holy, and that one does not listen to the objections about not wanting to be holier than anyone else. We must look ONLY to ourselves when it comes to the very delicate matter of personal holiness. How other people respond to the CALL TO HOLINESS IS SIMPLY NOT OUR BUSINESS. We must look after OUR OWN ANSWER to the CALL to holiness and not make guesses as to what others are doing about their call. DO NOT WAIT TO RESPOND TO GOD'S GRACE. We have heard how St. Augustine prayer: 'Lord, make me holy - but not just yet'; St. Augustine was taking a very great risk. One can go on saying 'NOT YET, LORD' for so long a time that one forgets what it was that he prayer for! In the same way one can go on saying, 'I can't bring myself to take such holiness on,' for so long a time that one can finally begin to believe that such is impossible for him! and then, of course, such a one will cease to feel the urge to be holy. Therefore, the process of becoming holy must begin NOW, and one has to UNDERSTAND it well that by GOD'S GRACE ONE CAN DO ALL THINGS!!!
