Concerning the question of the altar facing the people:

What has been described as a "desirable" change has now become common practice. And many are under the impression that this change simply represents the revival of an early Christian practice. But we can show with certainty that there has never been, neither in the Eastern nor the Western Church, a celebration FACING THE PEOPLE; rather, the direction of prayer has always been towards the East, FACING THE LORD!

The idea that the priest is to fact the people during Mass has its origins with Martin Luther, in his little book, "The German Mass and Order of Worship" (1526). At the beginning of the chapter entitled, "For the Lay People on Sundays," Luther writes:

" - - For the real Mass among true Christians, the altar should not remain in its current form and the priest should always face the people - as we can undoubtedly assume, Christ did during the Last Supper. Well, all this will come to pass in time."

That time has now, indeed, come to pass. Luther's undoubted assumption remains only an assumption, and in his assumption he fails to focus on the contradiction that such an assumption presents to the table etiquette observed in antiquity. Luther's argument is invalid.
