Therefore, there are certain important qualities which must come under strong discipline if they are to qualify in any sort of relation to charity. Such qualities are sensitiveness, dependence upon others, hospitality, pity, respect for others, service, zeal for souls. Each of these is a factor for good, provided it submits to the ANTISEPTIC of discipline. Without discipline you get only charity in reverse - - with all those dreary habits of mind such as jealousy, touchiness, moodiness, craftiness, possessiveness, depression, melancholy, suspicion, fussiness, and meanness. These are all, in a manner of speaking, serious diseases of the mind, and people go to psychoanalysts and psychiatrists seeking cures for them. The seeking of the cure is so much more difficult, while the application of the discipline of charity is so much easier and certainly more effective.

Without discipline in your affections you can become so wrapped up in your own love as to be indifferent to everyone else's sorrows. So long as your affection is reciprocated you could watch the whole world fall to bits before your very eyes and you would not feel a pang. Selfish affection, like selfish sorrow, is terribly isolating and terribly hard, and such a person is always full of sorrow, full of fear, full of anger, and consumed with doubt. The laughter of such a person clearly betrays his inner workings - the laughter is loud and hollow.
