Christ is the corner-stone, the principle of reconciliation, the unifying influence in all life, but particularly in the life of those who seek Him out and to be with Him with genuineness of heart and mind. In Christ we are one with others, we are one within ourselves, and we are one with God. Christ is Truth. The closer we come to Christ the closer we are to Truth. Those who are in fact close to Truth simply cannot be at odds with each other. If they happen to find themselves at odds with others, it is that one or the other is not close to Truth. It is as simple as that.

It is vital that we should not only be baptized into this unity but that we should also appreciate its significance. Unless we experience our oneness in Christ we see life always in division. All are called to serve God. Therefore, the service of God should be understood in simplicity rather than as a service of parts. For those who are in union with Christ, there can be no division. If there is division (and there is), the individuals in question who cause division seem to be more interested in promoting the programs they propose rather than in reflecting Truth which is Christ - - which is the Gospel. Truth is one - it has no parts. The spiritual life should bring unity out of multiplicity, and should reduce the rules of perfection to a single - simple - formula. As soon as we move away from the simple formula, complications inevitably set in. The spiritual life - to which we are ALL called - should allow love to emerge in peace from the diversity of its expressions.
