Wednesday, Friday and Saturday of this week are the Spring Ember Days, and are days of Fast and Abstinence. The Abstinence is partial on Wednesday and Saturday, and meat may be served at the main meal on those

days.

EMBER DAYS: - - - Ember Days are the days at the beginning of the Seasons, ordered by the Church as days of Fast and Abstinence. They were definitely arranged and prescribed for the entire Church by Pope Gregory VII for the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after December 13 (Feast of St. Lucy), after Ash-Wednesday, after Pentecost Sunday, and after September 14 (Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross). The purpose of their introduction was both to thank God for the gifts of nature, and to beg for a bountiful harvest. They are, as well, occasions to thank God for His merciful protection in time of storm, sickness, pestilence, fire, flood, and every form of evil.

(Under the present crisis of structure in the Catholic Church, it can hardly be said that failure to observe the rule of Fast and of Abstinence is seriously sinful. At most this instruction is more of a suggestion than it is an order to be followed. However, if neglected in a spirit of bad will, or maliciousness or disrespect, it would be safe to assume sin.

- 3. Confessions are heard before Masses on Sunday. Serious effort in the matter of confession especially during Lent simply has to be emphasized as a matter of real importance. To consider the Sacrament of Penance - confession - as a matter of small or no consequence, is surely presumptious and foolhardy.
