The man who lives in Christ sanctifies everything he touches or does. Whether writing a letter, washing dishes, writing a book, scrubbing floors, playing a game of baseball, milking a cow, feeding chickens or working a miracle - that man has his will formed according to the principle inside himself which is Christ. Since his will is rooted and founded in Christ, his whole being is Christ-like and all his acts are informed by Christ. This does not mean, however, that his exterior demeanor causes him to stand out in any way in the eyes of his beholders. The discipline of the human will is designed so to expand and extend the Christ-life that SELF is ousted and everything is seen in terms of the will of God: - even baseball and scrubbing floors.

If a man's will is right he is right everywhere and with everyone. If a man's will is wrong he is wrong everywhere, with everyone and with everything he does! Nothing can alter the direction of the man who has God and God only in his desire. In the same way, nothing can alter the direction of the man who does not have God in his desire, and even though such a man is visited with the success of the streets of the world, and even though such a man is greeted with the smiling faces of the people of the world, nothing changes the fact that God is not in his desire.

A man whose will has as its object only the will of God may do other things besides explicitly willing what God wills. He may think of other things besides uniting his will with God's will, but ALL THE TIME his intention is never for an instant to branch off from God will in order to follow his own. Whatever such a man does, thinks, suffers, enjoys, is assumed to be in virtue of the divine will. To the Divine will, therefore, the will of this man, purified now of all selfhishness, is united in perfect love and trust.
