St. Paul once said that Faith is "the evidence of things that are not seen." In an age when the dominant perspectives are turned away from the center of creation - away from God and turned toward man - there must be some effort made to restore right order. There has to be a serious involvement of EFFORT. Whatever restoration we desire will not happen simply because we wish it. There is a force pulling us away from God, and it is this force that we must do battle with, and this battle requires effort, hard work and a firm purpose! The Peace that is a gift from God is a condition of soul. The lowly shepherds of the Night of the Birth of our Divine Saviour can tell us much about the Peace of Heaven. These men, lowly though they were, were men of good will, and their good will was seen by God. For this they were highly favored.

The Blessed Mother, most certainly, possessed this great gift. The Saints of God all have been favored with Peace.
