end times is allegedly in existence, but for some reason is being withheld. Be that as it may man, as usual, has no regard for a matter of such serious proportions, and laughs as he continues to indulge in his vanities and his sin. But chastisement has now passed the point of promise, - - it is, indeed, at the point of progress, and its rising waters of faithlessness - MODERNISM - have reached, even to the tops of the highest mountains. Sadly, the powers of these raging torrents seem to be of little consequence to the men of our day, even as they are being swept off their feet by the force of the current. They watch disaster strike all around them, yet they laugh and laugh and laugh. And because they estimate chastisement to be something physical, they pay it no mind. The present chastisement is not of a physical nature - it is a totally spiritual one! That is why its enormity is beyond man's ability to grasp it properly - so he laughs. Even the men whose duty it is to try to understand it, whose duty it is to know, shy away from it. They also laugh!

1. Confessions are heard before Masses on Sunday. Please keep in mind that Penance is a Sacrament - and it gives Grace like all the Sacraments do. Lent is a time we must attend to the matter of Penance and Compunction. This matter cannot be taken lightly, or given an easy going interpretation. It is serious, and must be interpreted seriously.

2. In like manner must we take the weekly sermons and the weekly admonitions seriously. The points that are brought forth in our Weekly Bulletins must be carefully read and studied. Above all, however, our lives should show some bits of formation (and change) by the spiritual words that are given to us for nourishment. Sunday Mass, taken as an obligation which must be attended to, is of little help. We must sincerely wish honor and glory to God, our God, and we must sincerely wish go grow on the spiritual food that we receive from our Holy Religion.
