Points of interest in the History of Christ the King Abbey:

- (1) First Tridentine Mass celebrated in the tiny St. Francis Chapel. This was the first and beginning, though, very tiny chapel in a dwelling. This could be considered the beginning of Christ the King Abbey.  
March 1, 1981
- (2) Land Acreage of Christ the King Abbey purchased from Kenneth and Mary Gill:  
April 19, 1985
- (3) First Tridentine Mass Celebrated in the New St. Francis Chapel. This was a frame building, and had somewhat of a temporary nature about it. This chapel has been discontinued.  
May 13, 1986.
- (4) First Bulletin issued in the present series of Bulletins.  
July 1, 1986.
- (5) Joseph Sautner, First Novice, and now Father Michael, O.S.B. arrived in the middle of the night.  
October 28, 1988.
- (6) First Burial in the new St. Francis Cemetery - Mr. Walter Roberts.  
December 14, 1988.
- (7) Beginning of the First Novitiate of Christ the King Abbey:  
January 20, 1989.
- (8) First Vows (Simple vows for 3 years) pronounced at Christ the King Abbey:  
January 21, 1990.
- (9) First Speculum printed and mailed out:  
August 15, 1992.
- (10) First Tridentine Mass Celebrated in the New Abbey Church:  
December 24, 1994.
- (11) The beginning of the First Novitiate of St. Joseph (Convent) Monastery:  
October 8, 1995
