

Consecration, there is no Transubstantiation! The belief or the faith or the wishes of the people present in no way effects Transubstantiation. If the priest fails to fulfill ALL of the requirements in this matter, not bringing about Transubstantiation, the Faith of the people present will not take up where the priest left off. If the priest fails to Consecrate, the people receive no more than ordinary bread for communion, even if they believe otherwise. An interesting question comes up at this point: in those places where Benediction of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is observed, what are the people in adoration of? This has always been the official teaching, the constant and habitual and ageless teaching of our Catholic Religion. Belief in the Eucharist is basic Catholic Doctrine. Another question comes to mind: If one does not believe in the Eucharist, thinking it to be only a symbolic action, is such a one (priest or lay-person alike) properly called Catholic?

Present day erroneous teaching concerning the matter of the Transubstantiation, has brought about serious deviations in Catholic Worship, Catholic Life Experience, Catholic Observance, and Catholic Thought. Catholic Thought demands CORRECT and EXACT understanding and belief and acceptance of this fundamental Catholic teaching. It is not open to opinion, interpretation or adaptation - no matter who the teacher may be.

Today we pray for our Fathers. We ask God to bless them in the most special ways. We ask God to give the Fathers of the World the grace to be FATHER. As properly understood, and as God intended FATHER to be, the entire position of FATHER has deteriorated greatly, and today FATHER is not much more than the "Breadwinner", and the effectiveness of his authority is quite weak. If FATHER were where he is supposed to be, and if MOTHER supported and worked together with FATHER, we would not have children killing children and children burning down school houses and all such like. Let us not be too quick to put all the blame on CHILDREN. Therefore, today, let us pray that God work out a plan to rehabilitate FATHER, and let us pray that FATHER WILL rehabilitate FAMILY!!!
