is at this very point that we must take great care in the way we imitate the saints. Unguided imitation of the saints can become rather reckless at times and can be a source of great difficulty for us. Let us not forget that the saints were themselves human, once upon a time - like ourselves quite human - and struggling to reach the boundaries of sanctity. Our study of the lives of the saints should be for us a source of encouragement - rather than a cause for imitation. The Sacred Humanity of Jesus, all perfect as it is, is not for us the end of that we are reaching for. The Sacred Humanity of Jesus is the WAY that leads to that we are reaching for - the realm where man comes in contact with God Himself. The Sacred Humanity of Christ must be used by us as a means of reaching the Divinity of Christ - - of GOD. Too many of us get lost in the Humanity of Christ - its beauty, its sacredness, its simplicity, its poverty, its wisdom, its majesty, its holiness, its awesomeness, and we, then, completely forget the Divinity of Christ.
