

IN EPIPHANIA DOMINI





Thursday, January 6, 2000 is the Great Feast of the Epiphany of our Lord. While the Epiphany is not a holy Day of Obligation (in the U.S.) it remains, nevertheless, one of the most important feasts of the entire year. Everyone is encouraged to spend at least one hour in special prayer, reading and meditation on that wondrous day. Attending Holy Mass on Epiphany Day would truly wonderful and highly recommended if, in our time, things in Religion enjoyed the application they enjoyed in years past. Present circumstances make attendance at mass on such occasions quite impossible for most serious Catholics. Therefore, everyone is asked to do as best as circumstances permit. Observe your holy religion at home. Say your prayers at home and be quite conscientious about it. Keep the strength of your prayer life

strong, and fear not.
Epiphany Chalk will be distributed at all Masses Sunday. Inscribe all the doors of your home with the Holy Inscription - as you already know how.
God's Holy Angel will stand guard, and together with the Saints, Gaspar,
Melchior, and Balthazar, he will lead us and all of God's Faithful Elect to safety until we reach the Place where we will find Our Most Blessed Lord, Jesus, together with His Blessed Mother Mary and the Most Blessed Joseph. The Epiphany markings over our doors are a source of great wonderment and curiosity to all visitors - both catholic and protestant. In former times all such beautiful customs and symbolisms were commonplace in and around strong Catholic Family circles, and they were a wonderful cause of many conversions to the true Catholic Faith. The various manifestations of the "Sensus Catholicus" around the home underlined Catholic activity and increased the strength of the Faith amongst family members. Today all of that is gone, and forgetful of their Catholic origins, catholic people (as do protestant people) need instruction. Our once very Catholic Churches have been stripped of every Catholic symbolisms - naked halls - and our Catholic laity has lost every point of reference to the once glorious Catholic Religion: complete strangers to their religious heritage. CEREMONY FOR THE BLESSING OF HOUSES AND ALL PLACES FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF JESUS CHRIST.

BLESSING OF CHALK:

(Instruction: Chalk is blessed on the Altar, before Holy Mass begins. It will not be distributed by the priest, but can only be obtained by a member of the Family who must go up to the Altar, after Mass, and taking it. The Father of the Family will later use it to inscribe the initials of the Three Wise Men: Gaspar, Melchior and Balthazar, and the current year over the main door (and any other doors) of the home. This inscription should remain over the doors throughout the year.)

PASTOR: - Opening Antiphon: Behold, the Lord the ruler is come; and the kingdom is in His Hand, and power, and dominion.

O God, with your judgement endow the king, and with your justice, the king's son. Glory be to the Father. Behold, the Lord.
