

QUESTION #3

Transubstantiation demands, among other requirements, that the officiating priest intend to do what the church requires of every priest as he utters the sacred words of Consecration. The officiating priest MUST INTEND to transubstantiate the bread and wine to REAL BODY AND REAL BLOOD. If the priest does not believe in the Mystery and the Miracle of the Most Blessed Eucharist, is it not idle to think that he will have the proper intention of the church to bring about that which he has NO belief in? How can we judge the priest that believes? How can we judge the priest that does not believe?

QUESTION #4

If the people suspect that THE REAL SACRAMENTAL PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST IS NOT IN THE SACRAMENT PLACED BEFORE THEM - THEY HAVE NO BUSINESS EXTENDING SINFUL ACTS OF ADORATION TO A DECEPTION!

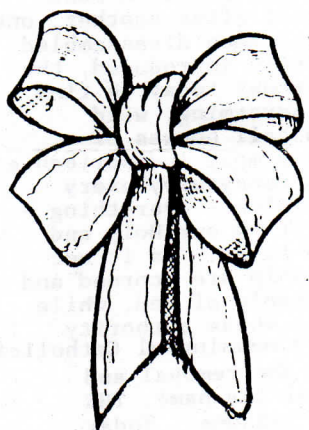
