*Strictly speaking, according to the precise terminology of the Church, Christ is neither physically nor spiritually present in the Eucharist. He is **Sacramentally** present, and sacramental presence is every bit as real as "physical" presence. There is a sacramental presence of Christ in the other sacraments too, but only in the Eucharist is this presence **substantial**. That is, the host we see, or receive, is truly Christ. He is not "in" the bread in some vague fashion.*

!After the Consecration, there is no bread.!

This is, indeed, the mystery of faith.
