Such style serves more the purpose of focusing attention than the preservation of modesty. Good taste and good style usually go well together, and well dressed men and women usually show forth modestly. Modesty in dress is not best achieved in styles of bygone days. When in the presence of God, good taste, stylishness and MODESTY should never demand criticism)

It must be understood that a multiplication of prayers, pious attitudes and pious practices is useless - though perhaps helpful reminders - if the above listed

ces have not first been conscientiously attended to.
Herein lies the CONVERSIO. Conversio is for EVERYBODY not for Monks and Nuns It should be kept uppermost in the minds and hearts of sincere Catholic Christian People that prayers, pious practices and pious attitudes DO NOT take the place of the CONVERSIO!
