with an over dose of "affection" is not necessarily the kind of formation children, especially the children of today, need. Homeschoolers should be on careful warning in this regard. In some traditionalist compounds, children are virtual prisoners of the "love" of their parents and religious leaders. This is wrong, and the wrongness of it all will blossom forth in all of its hideousness when the children become of age! Many will ask: "What shall we do?" The answer can only be found in the proper understanding of CONVERSIO. It is nonsense to look upon CONVERSIO as a turning the clock back to the days of yesteryear. CONVERSIO means a turning away from Evil and turning toward Good. It requires common sense, it requires humility, it requires that we show our children that that which is Good is more wonderful and beautiful than that which is Evil. To tell our children about the difference between Good and Evil, and turn right around ourselves by our example show them that we ourselves are not really convinced of what we preach simply destroys every fortification against Evil that has ever existed.
