Strictly speaking, according to the precise terminology of the Church, Christ is neither physically nor spiritually present in the Eucharist. He is **Sacramentally** present, and sacramental presence is every bit as real as "physical" presence. There is a sacramental presence of Christ in the other sacraments too, but only in the Eucharist is this presence substantial. That is, the host we see, or receive, is truly Christ. He is not "in" the bread in some vague fashion.

After the Consecration, there is no bread!

This is, indeed, the mystery of faith.
