7. Wednesday of this Week is ASH WEDNESDAY! It is not a holy day of obligation, but it is a day that should be observed , and Holy Mass is a must for that day. ASH WEDNESDAY is a day of solemn fast and solemn abstinence - and this should be seriously observed by all who are supposed to observe the fast and sbstinence regulation. ASH WEDNESDAY is a NO NONSENSE day! The celebration is now over, and the time of for serious reflection on our life's purpose begins. Ashes will be distributed at all Masses Wednesday, and at St. Pius Chapel in Birmingham next Sunday at the 9:30 A.M. Mass. The small packets of <u>Blessed</u> <u>Ashes</u> should be taken home and used as Sacramentals around the Home and Gardens.

Masses Wednesday will be at 6:00 A.M. - - - 8:00 A.M. - - - 7:00 P.M. (Last week's Bulletin was incorrect - the evening mass is at 7:00 P.M.)

Wednesday is ASH WEDNESDAY - and the thoughts of some people gently turn to thoughts of prayer and sacrifice. While prayer and sacfifice are certainly very good in themselves, "prayer" and "sacrifice" are NOT the reason and purpose of Lent. The reason and purpose of Lent is "US"! The reason and purposeof Lent is our SANCTIFICATION! During Lent our thoughts must concern themselves on the way our personal SANCTIFICATION can take place. This must be well understood, or we might find ourselves doing many wonderful things that remain useless: of no use whatever as far as our personal SANCTIFI-CATION is concerned. If what we do fails to bring about a GOD INTENDED change in our behavioral pattern, it all serves as nothing. The candy that we "give up" or the cigarettes or the whiskey that we "give up" - not bad in themselves - are the goings on of "light weight" catholics, insufficient in the bringing about of our SALVATION. Without proper conviction, even the burning of our bodies will always remain insufficient. Those who do not understand true CATHOLICISM look to their trivial efforts as necessarily demonstrative of strong conviction - as being solid evidence of their abhorence of sin and their avowed determination to save their souls. Even though our religious convictions are not to be guided by a set of rules, it should be obvious that whatever convictions we may have about our religious obligations must penetrate our superficial self justifying obediences! We must comprehend PURPOSE - GOD'S PURPOSE - the One Who placed us here, and the One we must be subject to. But God's PURPOSE is frustrated by man's self will! Therefore, this Lent, let us not waste precious time and energy on non-essentials such as candy and cake and ice cream. If we are truly in earnest about the fulfillment of God's purpose in "US" then let us give up something worth while - - - something that has real importance and meaning - - - - LET US GIVE UP OUR SELF WILL!
