God! One must read and reread - over and over - the prayer of the Pharisee to sense its viciousness and vile character: "O God, I give Thee thanks that I am not as the rest of men ... extortioners, unjust, adulterers, as also is this publican".

In the vaults of the guarded privacies of our mind, have we not - do we not - at times, judge ourselves as being different from the sinners of the world? Have we not - do we not - at times, consider our victories over sin as the result of our own efforts and determination? Have we ever understood that BUT FOR THE GRACE OF GOD working in us, we would be the worst of street people? Do we realize that we are in no position to place judgment on any man? Have we ever wondered at our own reactions when we are suddenly faced with the vicissitudes and temptations that torture our neighbor?

The boastfulness of the Pharisee was disgusting - especially so because of his state of life. He, if anybody, should have understood that to whom much has been given, from him more is expected. Instead of looking at his unworthiness and his unprofitableness, he boastfully looked upon himself as someone quite special and certainly above the rank and file of the unworthies of the world. No doubt, the Pharisee enjoyed the material securities the world of his day had to offer, and, no doubt, the comforts of his securities helped place him a cut above his fellowman. (To be continued)
