Such analyses serve only to keep the proud man on the center stage of his own imagination. Humility consists in the TURNING OF THE EYES AWAY FROM SELF. Any discussion about the matter simply keeps the mind focused and riveted on the very thing (SELF) that must be forgotten! Only with an uncomplicated assessment of our nothingness can we hope to attain the realization of the Divinity. Only when we look upon ourselves as truly nothing, only then can we set our eyes on God and HIM ALONE! St. Theresa has this to say: "When we really see our wretchedness, we no longer wish to look at ourselves, we only look at our Beloved."

Isn't it most interesting that our desire for "somethingness" brought into view our utter nakedness! While our admission of our nothingness brings into view HIM WHO IS!
