

Sometimes there was a touch of complaint in His words, but never was the strength or the determination of His efforts weakened. Certainly Our Blessed Lord was concerned about the fulfillment of His mission on Earth, but He was never moved to over-eagerness in His manner; neither was He moved to excitability when things had to be done. Can it be imagined that Our Lord ever shouted at anyone? Each day, with neither His dignity nor His calm even slightly ruftled, and unmoved from His earnestness by the previous day's failure, He resumed His work with the same love, the same force, the same courage, the same patience, the same determination, the same unimpaired energy of mind and will as before, exactly as if the disappointments of the past were not to be expected in the future.

He was always strong in His resolve. Never did He fear to tread the path marked out for Him by Divine Providence. Never was He to be found using His energies, His tife, or His talents to minister to His own personal satisfaction or to gratify His egoism. Though His sensitive nature was very often wounded through and through by the hostility, the ingratitude, the lack of belief, the want of understanding, and the downright dultness of even those nearest to Him, to say nothing of those who hated Him, He allowed nothing that He suffered from others to modify in the least the perfection of His attitude towards any of them. He spent no time in deploring the improprieties of any of those around Him, and never did He display the slightest hint of self-pity. He was always straightforward and His unambiguous words were carefully placed with his adversaries. He wasted no energy in rebellion against circumstances. Never did He passively submit to the inevitable with a gesture of indifference or a thought of despair. The whole attention of His great Soul was concentrated on the doing of the task that the occasion confronting Him offered, never once reflecting what it should mean to Himself in the watching eyes of men - men who were constantly looking at the outcome of His every move. The only thing that satisfied Him was that each task found the approval of His Eternal Father in Heaven.
