

There will be <u>NO</u> Catechism class after Mass until the Second Sunday after Epiphany (January 18, 2004).

2. Wednesday, December 24, 2004, is the Vigil of the Nativity (Christmas Eve). In every normal interpretation, Christmas Eve is a day of COMPLETE FAST AND ABSTINENCE. At the same time, Christmas Eve has to be understood to be a <u>festive</u> day of penance. Festivity simply cannot be suppressed on such a day – the eve of the greatest day in the history of Mankind. Therefore, on the occasion presenting itself in the home of GOOD-WILLED people, a bit of "shortcutting" in the law of fast and abstinence on that day is certainly not out of order.

3. CHRISTMAS MASSES IN THE ABBEY CHURCH ARE AT MIDNIGHT ON CHRISTMAS EVE AND AT 10:00 AM CHRISTMAS MORNING. The Church will be opened about 11:00 PM Christmas Eve. A recital of Christmas music will begin at 11:30 PM, for which we are grateful to Mr. Patrick Williams, who will be at the Abbey Church Organ for Midnight Mass. THERE WILL BE NO 6:00 AM MASS CHRISTMAS MORNING.

4. N.B.: CONFESSIONS WILL <u>NOT</u> BE HEARD BEFORE EITHER OF THE CHRISTMAS MASSES IN THE ABBEY CHURCH.

5. ANYONE RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION AT THE CHRISTMAS MIDNIGHT MASS MAY NOT RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION AGAIN AT A LATER MASS THAT DAY.

6. Mass at St. Pius V Chapel in Birmingham on CHRISTMAS DAY will be at 9:00 AM.

7. At the Christmas Midnight Mass Miss Adrienne Suzanne Liburdi will carry the Baby Jesus and place Him in the crib.

8. Christmas Day this year falls on Thursday. Therefore, the same rule applies to Friday, December 26, 2003, as applied to the Friday which followed Thanksgiving Day, namely: Friday, December 26, 2003, is <u>not</u> a day of abstinence. MEAT <u>MAY</u> BE EATEN ON THAT DAY.

9. Thursday, January 1, 2004 (New Years Day), is the Feast of the Circumcision of Our Lord and is a Holyday of Obligation. Masses in the Abbey Church will be at 6:00 AM and 10:00 Am ONLY.

10. By the wonderful grace of God, Michael Winland was Baptized and received into the Catholic Church yesterday. We are grateful to God for all His gifts and graces and we ask Him to bless and protect the Winland Family.

11. Please pray for all the Sick and Shut-ins of our Chapels, especially remembering Manny Gomez, Peggy Bonometti, Philomena Telker, and Salvatore Riccardi (Maria Morin's father). LET US ALSO PRAY FOR EVERYONE. Let us pray for ALL the priests and religious men and women of the world. NO MAN, WOMAN, OR CHILD SHOULD BE LEFT OUT OF OUR PRAYER. God made all men to be with Him in heaven for all eternity, and this includes every human being on earth, regardless of station or condition or place. Weak human nature and erroneous persuasions will prevent some from achieving the purpose intended for them by God, but that matter remains entirely between all such and God. We must make no judgments concerning such matters. If there is any sifting to be done, it is to be done by God, Himself alone. We are NOT the ones to do the sifting.

Those who are to be confirmed should select a Saint's name, and present it to the Bishop at the time of Confirmation. Special cards will be issued for this purpose on the day itself. The name of the Saint, as well as the official name of the person being confirmed, should be PRINTED in clear print.

During the Mass no places will be reserved. At the time of the ceremony, all those receiving Confirmation will approach as for going to Holy Communion, however, all the gentlemen will line up on the St. Joseph Chapel side of the center aisle, while all the ladies will line up on the Lady Chapel side of the center aisle, and approach the Bishop one at a time.

Private sponsors are not possible, and therefore private sponsors are not permitted.

Carefully check the above list of names. If there is an omission or any other error, please notify the Abbot (in person) immediately. If anyone is unsure about the reception of the Sacrament, please notify the Abbot (in person) immediately.

▼ IMPORTANT NOTICE **▼**

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be administered for those in regular attendance at our traditional Roman Catholic Chapels in Alabama, here in our Abbey Church, on January 11, 2004. The matter of the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation remains the obligation and responsibility of the <u>father</u> and <u>mother</u> of the one to be administered to. The grandparents are <u>not</u> the responsible parties, nor are they the ones to make the arrangements, since they are <u>not</u> the ones responsible before God for the upbringing of the child. *It is most necessary and important that at least one of the PARENTS of the child to be Baptized or Confirmed <u>regularly attend one of our Chapels</u>. For justifiable reasons, if the request for Baptism or Confirmation comes from elsewhere other than our own Chapels, then the <u>PARENTS</u> (<u>NOT</u> the grandparents) must submit a statement in writing from the priest in charge of the their traditional Chapel, stating that they - the parents - regularly attend the specified Chapel, and that he (the priest) is in agreement with the Sacrament being administered here at Christ the King Abbey in Alabama. If this cannot be verified, PLEASE DO <u>NOT</u> ASK.*

Baptismal Certificates are necessary for the reception of Confirmation and must be presented BEFORE any arrangements are made. <u>Unexpected arrivals should *not* expect to be admitted to the Sacrament of Confirmation.</u>

If the above rules cannot be honored, PLEASE DO NOT ASK.
