There will be NO Catechism class after Mass until the Second Sunday after Epiphany (January 18, 2004).

2. Thursday, January 1, 2004 (New Years Day), is the Feast of the Circumcision of Our Lord and is a Holyday of Obligation. Masses in the Abbey Church will be at 6:00 AM and 10:00 Am ONLY.

3. Because the first Thursday of January is New Years Day, and is a Holyday of obligation, we will <u>NOT</u> have our usual Holy Hours this Thursday; instead they will be postponed until next Thursday, January 8, 2004.

#### + + + THE CEREMONY FOR THE BLESSING OF EPIPHANY CHALK + + +

(Epiphany Chalk is used to write the inscription over all the doors of one's house. <u>Soft</u> classroom chalk of any color is best for writing on varnished or painted surfaces. A priest should bless the chalk on Epiphany Day, before the celebration of the main Mass of the day, using the following Blessing, which is taken from the Roman Ritual.)

- ). Behold, the Lord, the ruler is come; and the kingdom is in His hand, and power, and dominion. O God, with Your judgment endow the king, and with Your justice, the king's son.
- V. Glory be to the Father ... R. As it was in the beginning ... (Repeat the above: Behold, the Lord ...)
- ). All nations shall serve Him. R. All nations shall serve Him.
- ). Nations shall walk by Your light, and kings by Your shining radiance. R. All nations shall serve Him.
- ). All from Saba shall come, bringing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord. 

  R. All ...
- ). Rise up in splendor, O Jerusalem, for the glory of the Lord shines upon you. R. All nations shall serve Him.
- We have seen His star in the East, and have come with gifts to worship the Lord. R. All nations shall serve Him.
- ). The kings of Tharsis and the Isles shall offer gifts; the kings of Arabia and Saba shall bring tribute.

#### Priest: LET US PRAY:

O Lord God, bless # this chalk which Thou hast created, that it may be helpful to mankind; and grant that through the invocation of Thy most holy Name all those who use this chalk or with it write over the doors of their houses the names of Thy Saints, Gaspar, Melchoir, and Balthazar, may by their merits and intercession receive health of body and protection of soul. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen. (Priest now sprinkles chalk with Holy Water.)

(Later that day - or any day within the Octave of the Feast of the Epiphany - at home, the ceremony is completed by a priest or the father or senior member of the family. The following prayer is said once and at the main entrance of the house. All the family members should be present, and should accompany the priest or the head of the family as he or she goes from door to door - everyone keeping a respectful silence, or better yet, reciting the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary.)


# Ordination to the Subdiaconate

The Order of Subdeacon: Though not a sacramental Order, the Subdeaconate is considered a Major Order, ranked just below the sacramentally ordained Deacon. All those in Major Orders are no longer free to marry, and take up the obligation of the Divine Office. At Ordination the Subdeacon receives an empty chalice and paten, eruets with wine and water, and a basin and towel. Already wearing an alb, he is then invested with amice, maniple, and tunic (dalmatic). Finally, the new Subdeacon is given a book containing the Epistles, which he is now empowered to sing at Solemn Mass. The Subdeacon is also to bring to the altar and later remove the sacred vessels at Solemn Mass, and to directly assist the Priest when the Deacon is otherwise occupied.

Those who are to be confirmed should select a Saint's name, and present it to the Bishop at the time of Confirmation. Special cards will be issued for this purpose on the day itself. The name of the Saint, as well as the official name of the person being confirmed, should be PRINTED in clear print.

During the Mass no places will be reserved. At the time of the ceremony, all those receiving Confirmation will approach as for going to Holy Communion, however, all the gentlemen will line up on the St. Joseph Chapel side of the center aisle, while all the ladies will line up on the Lady Chapel side of the center aisle, and approach the Bishop one at a time.

Private sponsors are not possible, and therefore private sponsors are not permitted.

Carefully check the above list of names. If there is an omission or any other error, please notify the Abbot (in person) immediately. If anyone is unsure about the reception of the Sacrament, please notify the Abbot (in person) immediately.

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be administered for those in regular attendance at our traditional Roman Catholic Chapels in Alabama, here in our Abbey Church, on January 11, 2004. The matter of the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation remains the obligation and responsibility of the father and mother of the one to be administered to. The grandparents are not the responsible parties, nor are they the ones to make the arrangements, since they are not the ones responsible before God for the upbringing of the child. It is most necessary and important that at least one of the PARENTS of the child to be Baptized or Confirmed regularly attend one of our Chapels. For justifiable reasons, if the request for Baptism or Confirmation comes from elsewhere other than our own Chapels, then the PARENTS (NOT the grandparents) must submit a statement in writing from the priest in charge of the their traditional Chapel, stating that they - the parents - regularly attend the specified Chapel, and that he (the priest) is in agreement with the Sacrament being administered here at Christ the King Abbey in Alabama. If this cannot be verified, PLEASE DO NOT ASK.

Baptismal Certificates are necessary for the reception of Confirmation and must be presented BEFORE any arrangements are made. Unexpected arrivals should not expect to be admitted to the Sacrament of Confirmation.

If the above rules cannot be honored, PLEASE DO NOT ASK.
