go to work in the performance of solid and genuine VIRTUE.

PRAYER, even the most earnest of prayer, for the Virtue of Purity, remains fruitless so long as we continue to frequent forbidden places and continue to look at forbidden pictures, etc. The search for sanctity remains absurd so long as we continue our search for "whatever," sloshing about in the swampy wastes of the television, the internet, etc. If we know that the brackish swampy wastes are infested with poisonous snakes, then it makes sense that we should keep out - why pause even briefly? A momentary glance is enough to poison us for an entire lifetime.

PRAYER, even the most earnest of prayer, for the Virtue of Meekness, remains fruitless so long as we refuse to put a restraint on out lightening-quick flashes of irrational temper and our white-hot explosions when met with even the slightest contradiction or opposition. Do we resent constructive and instructive criticism and reject its corrective suggestions - or - do we accept constructive and instructive criticism and permit it to change our character defects and personality flaws? Does constructive and instructive criticism offend and insult us?

PRAYER, even the most earnest of prayer, for the Virtue of Contemplation, remains quite fruitless so long as we keep feeding our imagination with trashy novels and rubbish magazines. When we go "browsing" in the bookstores, in the libraries, or on the internet, do we resist the almost magnetic pull toward the seamy sections? And when we read, do we read to satisfy our insatiable curiosity or is our reading the Voice of God speaking to us? PRAYER, even the most earnest of prayer, for the Virtue of Poverty, remains fruitless so long as we continue to frequent the most fashionable and expensive shops around, or visit the most elegant places of entertainment, or purchase the most expensive automobiles and "play toys".

PRAYER, even the most earnest of prayer, for the Virtue of Temperance remains fruitless so long as we continue to keep our pantries well stocked with the finest and most expensive of food and drink. PRAYER, even the most earnest of prayer, for the Virtue of Charity, remains fruitless so long as we have little

or no heart-felt compassion for the needs of others. Do we really CARE for those we are responsible for? What is the quality of the service we give to those who need our help, our presence, our generosity? Is assistance given promptly and lovingly and responsibly and generously, regardless of the inconvenience, when others call upon us unexpectedly? These are but some of the areas that call for genuine, honest, and careful examination. As time goes on we will present

more and more of that which gives refinement to the spiritual art. (To be continued)
