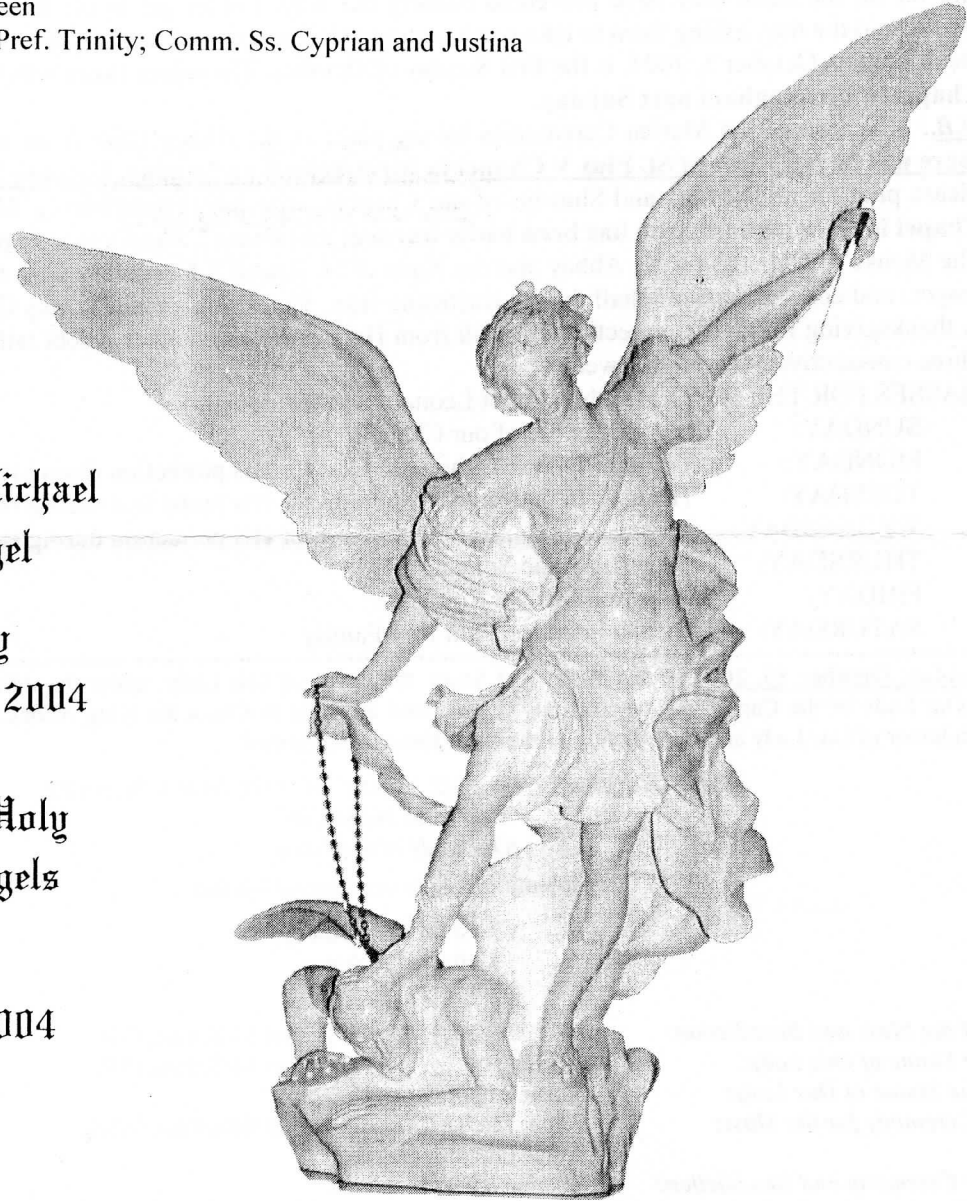

Rd. 1518 for 7/10 mile
- At the stop sign, make a sharp right turn
onto Cty. Rd. 1545
- Drive 2/10 mile. The Goldridge Commun-
ity Center is on the left (building with
white siding) right next to the Fire Station.
