- W. Blessed is the man who hears me and who watches daily at my gates and at the post of my doors. R. All nations...
- R. And let my cry come unto You. V. O Lord, hear my prayer.

Father: LET US PRAY:

Hear us, O Holy Lord, Father Almighty, Eternal God, and send Thy Holy Angel from Heaven to watch over, cherish, protect, be with, and defend all who live in my house.
