

1. There WILL be Catechism class after the 10:00 AM Mass this morning.
2. There WILL be the usual 5:00 Sunday Vespers and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament this afternoon.
3. Today begins the Novena to our most Holy Father Saint Benedict, whose Feast Day is March 21. Please join us in special prayer to Saint Benedict, especially during these most troubled and uncertain times.
4. Tomorrow, March 13, 2006, is the transferred Feast of Saint Gregory the Great. 7. **Stations of the Cross** each Friday evening during Lent at 7:00 PM, followed by Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Our very troubled times cry out for special penance and sacrifice. Those who can are urged to attend the Stations (or at least do so in their home chapels) and offer this sacrifice for the welfare of all those whose will is good and whose intention is to love God with genuine devotion but who, because of circumstances, are unable to live the life asked of them by their Holy Religion.

First Confessions will be heard on the Sunday before Mother's Day (May 7, 2006).**
