Anytime our Lord gave a lesson to the people, He followed it with an appropriate parable which would give understanding and meaning to the listeners. He always explained the meaning of His lessons clearly, at least to the Apostles. Let it we carefully noted that there was NO PARABLE here. He clearly said what He meant and He meant exactly what He said – and THAT WAS THAT! When some of His hearers, refusing to believe, went away – HE LET THEM GO! He did not call them back, promising to explain. There was no explanation, and as they would not accept His word – HE LET THEM GO THEIR WAY! He would also have let the Twelve Apostles go had they too refused to take His words exactly as he said them and exactly as He meant them. The way in which He was going to make this wondrous Gift to man and the manner in which His Body and Blood were to be received, He did not at that time explain.

Sadly watching the people leave Him, He turned to the Twelve and asked, "Will you also go away?"

Simon Peter, his face aglow with love and loyalty, replied for all, "Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life. And we have believed and have known that Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Christ felt keenly the rejection by His chosen people of His best Gift, and the cold and unbelieving desertion and hardening of heart of so many of them. He felt an even greater sadness knowing as He did of the many who, throughout the ages would walk away form Him saying, "This is a hard saying, who can hear it?" So is the same being said, even to this present day, especially by so many of His "consecrated" and "committed" "disciples", His official teachers of truth and doctrine, who loudly proclaim from their places of authority that the words of Christ were merely symbolic! Who say with authority, "To go to church on the grounds that one can visit God Who is present there is a senseless act which modern man rightfully rejects." HORROR OF HORRORS!
