If the conditions of the hearts and minds of men are as **God** has traced them out to be in space and time, then we must never let the unbearable – and usually concocted – restrictions traced out by the bitter zeal of bitter and unhappy men be a cause for worry and fear, whoever and wherever we may be. It is not for <u>any</u> of us to do any sifting of souls. We are not the judges of anybody! We sift out absolutely nobody. That is the business of God, and God alone. Unfortunately there exists a vast number of souls who do not wish to participate in the awesome work of salvation. This is a specialized choice in many cases. In many cases, too, placement of people is arranged by the infinitely perfect and wise and loving will of God. Even in situations such as these, judgment remains the business of God alone – it is not our work or worry. We pray for all men – just a Christ died for all men!

The love of God, as it grows in the heart of man, gradually brings light and dispels the gloom of the street, just as the rising of the sun gradually dispels the gloom of the dark night. Clearly expressed in the First Commandment – the Great Commandment – is the total importance of the love of God. It is, therefore, the end, the perfection, and the ultimate beauty of the universe. That Commandment is indeed like the sun which illumines and gives dignity to all the holy laws, the divine precepts, and even to all the Sacred Scriptures. Everything was created for that heavenly love, and everything that exists is related to it. It is the Great Commandment, and its perfect execution carries over into life eternal – in fact, it is life eternal itself.

This subject is inexhaustible, but we have reached the limits allowed for this instruction. Therefore we come to its conclusion. However, even in its conclusion we cannot overlook the Second Commandment. Without the Second Commandment, the First Commandment simply loses all of its intent. Indeed, the two Commandments are really one. Without love of neighbor abiding in us it is inconceivable that the love of God can abide in us. Whoever separates himself from his neighbor automatically separates himself from the love of God, no matter how vocal his prayer or how loudly he protests his love for God. The first two Commandments may be two in number, nevertheless they are but one in actual fulfillment. We will give further consideration to Charity in later Bulletins.
