

Emotional Immaturity

(Part one of two parts)

(The following quotation, though written for nuns, applies equally to everyone.)

"All of these reactions point to an emotional immaturity that ill becomes a Christian. Much more does it ill become a religious. You must begin to realize that you shall have to grow up emotionally, that you shall have to become a mature woman. This is what is meant by a change of heart. You must no longer allow your reactions to continue as responses of your sensibilities to outward stimuli. They must become the product of a mature human nature expressing itself through the union of all its components, and not merely through your emotions divorced from the direction of your mind and the control of your will. In other words, you must become a Christian of character and stop being a creature of temperament. Temperament is not character. It is only character's basic element, which, in itself, is unstable, changeable, unequal to stress and strain, impulsive. Whatever temperament you should happen to possess has its own peculiar qualities and faults. But these have to be directed by rational discernment and controlled by Christian habits of will before you can lay claim to the possession of Christian character. Unless you pay serious attention to this direction and control of your temperament you will continue throughout your religious life to be a slave of immature attitudes and outward temperamental reactions. There will, thus, be no progress for you in the way of holiness, nor any sustained peace in your soul. There are still in you all the psychological traces that years of temperamental reaction have deepened and strengthened. These will not be undone in a day. But your own personal happiness, the happiness of all those with whom you will be living in the close intimacy of the convent life, the happiness of superiors who will have to guide you, depend upon your being grown up enough to begin to undo them vigorously now, and to complete the work as soon as possible."
