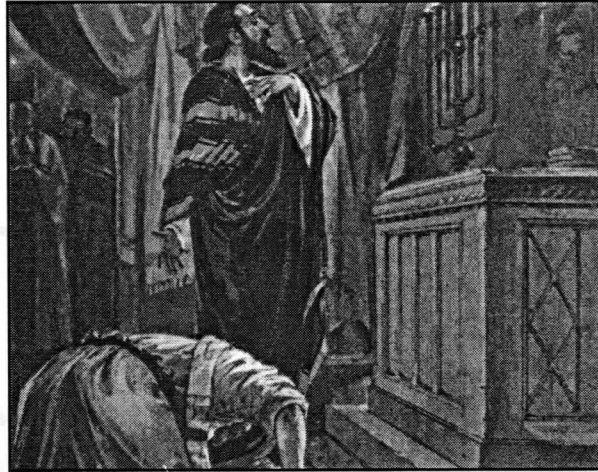

Emotional Maturity

(Part two of two parts)

(The following quotation, though written for nuns, applies equally to everyone.)

“This emotional maturity, toward which you have now to work, is a human thing, and, as such, mind, emotions, and will have to appear in it. To acquire it, you must train your mind to perceive reality, practice your emotions to respond only to those stimuli that are proportioned to them, and you must control the emotions thus evoked by strong habits of will. However, since you are in training for the spiritual and religious life, it is of advantage to realize that in this training you are not just bipeds to be conditioned by reflexes. You are children of your Heavenly Father and that relationship must never be lost sight of in your maturing. Since God is the ultimate reality, He cannot be safely left out of training in emotional maturity. Not having been accustomed to Christian thinking, you have left Him too much out of your thoughts and your life. You must begin to see Him at the center of things. It is He who directs all this world and all the circumstances of it, whether they be favorable to you or not, to suit His own divine purposes. You must begin to see His hand in everything that happens. That is seeing reality. You must begin to see things, not in the light of your own satisfaction or dissatisfaction, but in the light of truth, of God's all-pervading Providence. You must become convinced that everyone and everything do not have to please you, that there is something greater and bigger than you in the universe, namely, God's design. You must learn to accommodate yourself to things as they exist in fact, and cease to rebel against them, or to react viciously because they happen to be at variance with your preconceptions of how they should be. Uproot yourself violently from the center of the universe, and implant God in His rightful place.” (*The Martyrdom of Change*, by Desmond F. McGoldrick, C.S.Sp., 1961)
