 - o If I want to watch bad movies, listen to bad music, and read bad books, then it is all right for me to do so.
 - o If I want to eat meat on Friday, then it is all right for me to eat meat on Friday.
 - o If I want to do unnecessary work on Sunday, then it is all right for me to do unnecessary work on Sunday.
 - o If I want to deliberately miss Mass on Sunday, then it is all right for me to deliberately miss Mass on Sunday.

 - o If I want to dress immodestly, then it is all right for me to dress immodestly.
